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How Much Does A Nanny Typically Cost?

The cost of your nanny will depend on your unique needs. To understand the value of a caregiver that truly is right for you, you need to consider your criteria:

- How experienced do you want your nanny to be?
- How many hours per week does your nanny need to cover?
- Are you looking for a caregiver with specialised experience or particular qualifications?
- Do you need a nanny who can drive your children to school or activities?

A good rule of thumb is that the rate will be higher for nannies with more experience and qualifications, and of course the rate will also depend on your specific requirements.

Rates of Pay

Nannies typically charge \$25-\$45+ per hour. You can expect to pay around \$25 for less experienced care and \$40+ for more experienced care. Make sure to offer at least the minimum award rate and include additional fees such as taxes, domestic worker's insurance and superannuation.

Insurance, Tax and Super

You are required to pay super if your nanny works for 30+ hours and receives \$450 or more before tax in a calendar month. You should also register for PAYG withholding.

When you hire a caregiver as an employee, you need Workers Compensation Insurance which covers your nanny in the event of an accident. Since insurance is different in every State and territory, make sure to visit the Fair Work Ombudsman and find the full list of coverage across Australia. If a nanny is driving your car to take kids to school or other activities, you should include them under your vehicle insurance policy.

If you need assistance with meeting your payroll obligations there are some excellent nannyfocused solutions we recommend such as NannyPay.

Benefits

Don't forget that nannies hired as employees are entitled to benefits. They can take a paid holiday or sick leave which you are required to cover. Full-time and part-time employees are entitled to a minimum of 20 days of annual leave. If you want to hire a live-in nanny, you must be able to provide a comfortable private room and usually include their food in the employment package.

From hiring a full-time nanny to finding someone who can cover a couple of hours per week, there are many different options available. Depending on your childcare needs and your budget, you can find a solution that really works for your family. When you write down answers to these questions, you will have a clearer image of your ideal nanny.

You should also think about the personality traits you are looking for in a nanny. Who would be a perfect fit for your family? What makes your family special? It helps to make a list of qualities you would love your nanny to have. Then when you place your job ad, you should specify if you're looking for someone who is punctual, organised, hygienic, efficient, energetic, calm, loving, caring, creative etc.

And here's a helpful tip! It's better to list the ideal traits of a nanny you are looking for, rather than saying you're looking for 'Mary Poppins' or 'Mrs Doubtfire'.

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How To Post A Nanny Ad That Attracts The Right Candidates

The key to a successful job post is striking the right balance. You need to make it appealing to attract many applicants, but you also need to be very specific about what you require and what you offer.

After helping thousands of parents find an amazing nanny, we know which ads get a lot of responses, and we've made writing an amazing job listing a breeze for you! All you need to do is ensure your job listing has **8 Key Elements.**

8 Key Elements of an Effective Job Ad

- Title It should be informative, but also short and catchy. This is the first thing that nannies will see when they are browsing jobs, so you want your title to stand out and be to the point.
- 2. Hourly Rate It's important to list the hourly rate to help qualify candidates. Leaving this blank will limit the number and quality of applicants.

- Location Make sure you list your location to ensure you are contacted by nannies nearby. Job Listings are searchable by Postcode to protect your privacy.
- 4. Requirements Select all the requirements you need the nanny to have. Do they need a driver's license? First aid certification? Police check? Please note that it is a legal requirement for nannies to have a Working With Children's Check to care for children, so you must request and verify this information from your applicants.
- 5. Job Details Outline the specifics of the role. How many children require care? What are their ages? When is the care required? Does the role need to be pet-friendly?
- 6. Describe Your Beautiful Family - Here is where you describe your family so that nannies can imagine what it would be like spending time with your family.


- 7. Describe The Duties Of the Caregiver - Describe the role as much as you can. What are all the tasks that would be involved in a usual day? Are there any special considerations? What are your expectations about availability?
- 8. Describe Your Ideal Caregiver - Use this section to describe the traits you are looking for in a nanny and what would make for a wonderful fit for your family.

To attract candidates that are suitable, we recommend following three important principles: be **clear, specific and genuine**. Be upfront about your expectations at the start, while also adding your personal touch.

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Interviewing & Shortlisting Candidates

nce you post a fantastic job ad, your next task is to shortlist the applicants you think could fit the role and prepare for the interviews.

Selecting the Candidates

Review all the applications you received and think about the pros and cons of hiring each of them. Eliminate nannies from your list that definitely don't satisfy your criteria. It's really important to listen to your intuition. You are looking for a long-term nanny that will become a wonderful part of your family dynamic. So you don't want to rush this process. If you feel unsure about a particular candidate, understand how they have made you feel. Speaking to candidates in person will reveal a lot more about them, but don't be afraid to let your intuition guide this screening process.

Scheduling Interviews

Once you select potential candidates, it is best to start with a phone call. If you can, schedule a video call so that you can see them and find out more about their personalities. If you feel comfortable to proceed, the next step is to have them in your home. It is always a good idea to schedule a meeting when the whole family is there so that your children can meet the nannies as well. If you really like a particular candidate and if there is enough time, you can perform a little trial and assign a task for the nanny to assess their skills. This is a great opportunity to see how they behave around children and find out whether the little ones like them. It's really important to see how they engage with your child and how your child responds - for many parents, this is the most important factor.

Interview Tips



An interview can reveal plenty of information if you have the right questions. We suggest that you prepare well for each interview. While some of the questions will be the same for all of the candidates, some will have to be rather personal.

Prior to an interview, read the application because you want to be well prepared for the conversation. Write down all the questions and list all the paperwork you want the candidates to prepare for your meeting. Make sure to verify all the documents and references because the employment arrangement will be directly between you and the nanny.

The first set of questions can be about the nanny's qualifications and experience. Feel free to go into details and ask them to describe families they worked for and specify the number of children or list their daily tasks. This will reveal a lot about their previous experience. One of the most important questions to include is why they have stopped working for their previous employers. Be sure to dig deeper on this point and be comfortable with their reason. The applicant should also have the opportunity share their expectations about families they want to work for.

IMPORTANT

You must check a nanny's certifications and qualifications from their resume. They must provide evidence of their First Aid Certificate, Police Check, Working with Children's Check, Driver's License or any other documents, and it is your responsibility to verify these documents - especially the Working With Children's Check. While each State is different, it's a simple process to visit the website of your State's governing department to confirm the details.

The next part of the interview can be dedicated to exploring the nanny's methods and development philosophies when caring for children. Ask them to describe their approach to childcare and describe their general style to engaging with children. This will help you find out how they handle different situations and how they behave around children. Be sure to ask them how they would respond to specific examples you have experienced with your child.

In the third part of the interview, you can dive into your nanny's personality. Ask about their lifestyle, interests, hobbies, family and ambitions in life. The nanny you choose will become a member of your household, and you want to get a clear idea of how you'll get along. This conversation is intended to get to know each other on a deeper level.

Once you feel an applicant would be a great fit for your family, you should discuss the practicalities of the role. The best chance for this engagement to succeed overtime is for both parties to be clear about what they want, and agree to these terms before entering into an engagement.

To conclude your interview, you can ask the nanny to provide a list of references with contact information. An experienced nanny should be able to provide references, and you should proceed with caution if they do not provide a decent list.

Before you seal the deal, it's also good to arrange a trial period (and you must remunerate the applicant for their hours during this trial period, even if you don't proceed).

Checking references

Checking references is a crucial step towards finding a perfect nanny for your family. Even a great resume, impressive qualifications and a fantastic interview aren't enough to prove that someone is actually fit for the job. A respectable nanny will be able to provide professional references and not just letters sent by friends or family members. Talking to their previous employers will reveal vital information about your potential nanny.

Providing professional references should be one of the most important requirements mentioned in your iob ad. You can ask potential candidates to attach at least two reference letters and send them along with their application. Make sure that you check with the nanny that their references have given permission to share their contact information before asking for them. It's very important that you at least call the previous references to have a candid discussion - do not just relu on a written reference.

When speaking with the references, here are some of the most important questions to ask:

- What was the duration of their engagement with you?
- Was it a full-time, part-time or a live-in arrangement?
- Did they keep to the agreed schedule?
- How many children have they been looking after?
- What were their ages?
- How did they engage with your children?
- What was their motivation and enthusiasm like?
- Did they keep things clean and tidy while caring for the children?
- What are their five most important qualities?
- Did they ever have to deal with an emergency? How did they handle it?
- Were there any aspects of childcare you think they could have improved on?
- Why did you end the contract with them?
- Would you hire them again?
- Is there anything else you would like to add that should be considered before hiring?

The best way to communicate with referees is by phone. Try calling them and ask if they have time to talk. If they are not located in Australia, you can email them and try to schedule a video call. Remember that a good referee will be open to answer your questions and provide all the information you need. If you encounter someone who hesitates to give you answers, it might not be a good sign.

How to Make a Decision?

You may not have considered it but when you're on the lookout for a nanny, you should actually be searching for more than one. It's important to have a range of great nannies that can work around your family. As children grow, their needs, as well as yours, will change. One nanny may be able to provide all the care that you need for now. However, can you imagine how disruptive it could be to your family if that flow of support suddenly stops?

So when you're searching for a nanny, be sure to keep a shortlist of the best applicants rather than simply focusing on just one. By doing this, you will ensure that you can pick a few great nannies so you're never left without one should any issues occur.

When you have a pool of great potential candidates, take your time to choose one that will be a great long-term solution for your family. When they accept, be sure to let the other candidates know that you would like to keep them on file in case things change.





Employment, Payroll & Obligations

ow that you've found a perfect nanny, it is time to seal the deal. You will need to get familiar with your obligations as an employer and create a contract.

Your Obligations

If you are employing your nanny, then make sure to visit the Fair Work Ombudsman webpage which offers information about your specific obligations, including free resources and templates for making important documents such as contracts, checklists and payslips.

Your key obligations include:

- minimum workplace entitlements
- minimum wage
- paying super (if your nanny will be working 30+ hours)
- registering for PAYG withholding

- registering for a Fringe Benefit Tax (if benefits are included in the remuneration agreement, such as free rent for a live-in nanny)
- getting Workers Compensation Insurance

Your duty is also to make the contract as comprehensive as possible. Before you make the first draft, you should agree with your nanny on the terms ensuring that both sides are happy with the arrangement. You should also clarify the terms for ending the contract if the agreement doesn't work out.

Creating a Contract

A contract must be created and signed by both parties before commencing employment. It is very important to ensure that you and your nanny are on the same page before you sign this document. Take your time to discuss the terms with them in detail. While engaging a nanny is a personal journey for your family, at the end of the day it is a working relationship and both parties must act accordingly.

The purpose of the contract is to give you and your nanny clarity about expectations. It may come across as a very formal thing to do, considering that your caregiver is someone who will become a part of your family. But it has to be done because it secures a better understanding and a quality relationship. It can prevent any potential issues and provide clear grounds to discuss problems if they arise. A contract provides protection to both parties and ensures all rights are respected. In a nutshell, it is just so much easier when both sides know the rules!

The additional benefit of a contract is the ability to track your nanny's performance. This document states all of their duties which makes it easier for you to keep records and do annual performance reviews.

We recommend parents and nannies visit the Fair Work Ombudsman website for all the information they need about their obligations. 

Working with Children Check (WWCC)

A Working with Children Check (WWCC) is a legal requirement for any person involved in caring for children, and it is your responsibility as a parent to verify that a nanny's check is valid before caring for your child.

Checks are administered by each State and Territory. You can verify a Working With Children Check online.

National Police Check

A National Police Check can be undertaken online and takes a few days to process. A National Police Certificate is a document that lists an individual's disclosable court outcomes and pending charges. National Police Checks can only be done with the consent of the person that the check is for. Police checks are valid at the time of application, so it's up to the parent to determine if a new check is needed.

Children's First Aid

Children hurt themselves; it's a fact of life. As part of their physical development, they will challenge themselves and be hurt. Will your caregiver know what to do? Will you know what to do?

Have Regular Performance Reviews

Regular performance reviews are very helpful to ensure that both sides feel heard. It is a good idea to go through the contract with your nanny and discuss all the points. This will help you figure out what is working for you and what isn't. If either side has failed to cover some of their duties outlined in the contract, you can discuss the problems and try to find solutions.

If you are happy with your nanny's performance, be sure to tell them! Your engagement will strengthen if you can provide specific examples where they have shone. Everyone likes to hear they are doing a great job, so don't expect your nanny will know this if you don't directly share your sentiments. Regular reviews are also the appropriate times to discuss wages. If you are intending to engage a nanny for long-term care, wage inflation should be expected (just like any job). Be sure to have chats with your nanny from time to time and find out what makes them happy or what they really need.
